June/July 2027	Day 0	Arrive in Lima	Everyone must arrive in Lima at minimum the day before the departure to Jaen. Evening "Meet and Greet" in the hotel with the expedition group.	TBC	Lima (San Isidro)	Airport transportation to the hotel in Lima. Accommodations.
June/July 2027	Day 1	Depart Lima – Arrive Jaen	Fly to Jaen (depart Lima early morning). Visit award wining co-op CEPROA Private tour of archeological wonder: Monte Grande (with <i>cacao ritual</i>).	Early morning flight to the northern town of Jaen, in the Cajamarca department. After hotel Check-in, we will visit a small yet award winning co-op: CEPROA After lunch we'll have a Private tour of Monte Grande, an <i>active</i> archeological site where they have discovered ancient artifacts showing that this is where cacao was first domesticated over 6000 years ago! We will enjoy a private tour of the site and watch the sunset from its incredible view while partaking in a cacao ritual (like the ancient civilization of this region had at this very site).	Jaen	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner. All transportation (airport transfers, flights, touring vans), guided activities, and event fees. Accommodations.
June/July 2027	Day 2	Stay in the Jaen area	Drive to Huarango. Visit the association that produces the Marañon cacao. Visit farmer fincas, including the finca of Don Fortunato, home of world-renowned "Fortunato No. 4".	The tour will be led by Aurelio Loret de Mola, one of Peru's most renowned cacao experts. Private tour of the co-op that processes the illustrious Marañon bean. And, of course, we will visit the fincas of various farmers that supply this co-op—including the finca of Don Fortunato, where the world-renowned "Fortunato No. 4" was discovered.	Jaen	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner. All transportation (touring vans with drivers), guided activities, tours, and event fees. Accommodations.
June/July 2027	Day 3	Depart Jaen - Drive to Bagua Grande	Visit finca and cacao collection of Mario Zuloeta. Visit the APROCAM Co-op, with special guests to perform an Awajun cacao ceremony. Visit CEPROA Co-op (time permitting).	We will visit the incredible finca of Mario Zolueta, the ex-president of the APROCAM co-op. Nestled in the jungle between streams and rice plains, it's a picturesque site that is hard to describe and unforgettable. Mario harvests cacao and also has an active genetic plantation for research purposes to showcase the many cacao genetics of that region. We will also visit the post harvest facility of the APROCAM co-op, where they ferment and dry the cacao. And... a special cacao ceremony event performed by the native tribal members of the Awajun community.	Bagua Grande	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner. All transportation (touring vans with drivers), guided activities, tours, and event fees. Accommodations.
June/July 2027	Day 4	Depart Bagua – Arrive Gocta	Depart for the Kuelap Cloud City Fortress (early morning). Guided tour of the cloud fortress.	Peru has hundreds of incredible ancient sites, amongst them, in the northern Andes, exists the sacred Cloud Fortress of Kuelap. This is the Machu Picchu of the north, but 3 times larger and at least 600 years older! It is still a relatively well-kept national secret. This cloud city was created by the Chachapoyas culture. It is an archeological wonder, and extremely unique compared to any other building structures of the Americas. To arrive we will take a gorgeous 20-minute gondola ride (4 km) and a trail walk (30min) to finally reach this sacred site perched on top of the mountains at ~3000 meters above sea level. We will have a ~3hr guided tour of this incredible fortress with jaw dropping views. Gocta	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner. All transportation (touring vans with drivers, gondola, etc.), guided activities, tours, and event fees. Accommodations.
June/July 2027	Day 5	Explore Gocta – Depart for Bagua	A day in Gocta. Trail walk to the world's 3rd tallest free-leaping waterfall and bathe in its water.	You will awaken in the scenic jungle of the Amazonas department—a close grasp away from the stunning waterfall Gocta, the 3rd tallest free-leaping waterfall in the world. A sacred site were ancient cultures performed rituals and bathed in its crashing waters. After an early breakfast, all who wish to immerse themselves in nature and bathe in the falls, can join a guided group on a scenic trail to the falls. It will be an early departure (~830 am), and the trail is about ~2 hrs. If you wish, horses are available for the trail ride (added cost). After some time in the falls, we will head back around 11:30 am to have lunch in Gocta Lodge and spend the rest of the evening in this beautiful hotel.	Gocta	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner. All transportation (touring vans with drivers [horses not included]), guided activities, tours, and event fees. Accommodations.

June/July 2027	Day 6	Drive to Jaen - Flight back to Lima	Departure for Jaen and flight back to Lima.	After breakfast, we will have an early departure for short drive to Jaen where we take a 2hr flight back to Lima. (Time permitting, we may visit some additional cacao farmers and local chocolate makers in Jaen)	Lima (San Isidro)	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner. All transportation (touring vans with drivers, flight), guided activities, tours, and event fees. Accommodations.
June/July 2027	Day 7	Lima-Mala-Lima	Early departure to Mala - for a tour of Cacao Life processing facility and farm grounds.	Early departure to Cacao Life's processing facility in Mala, where you will have a guided tour of our plant and the rest of our property, where we plant bananas, passion fruit, lucuma, and various other tropical fruits, and well as a large greenhouse with one of the largest collections of Cacao Genetic diversity in the world. You will have a look at how we make all the various cacao products, as well as other superfood derivatives. We will have a nice lunch in our large garden with our plant workers. Our last group dinner will be planned in a memorable restaurant in heart of the culinary capital of Latin America (Lima), where we will enjoy amazing food, ambiance, and conversation.	Lima (San Isidro)	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner. All transportation (touring vans with drivers, flight), guided activities, tours, and event fees. Accommodations.
June/July 2027	Day 8	Stay in Lima	Visit the Salon de Chocolate y Cacao	We will be attending the 1 st day of the prestigious Salon de Chocolate y Cacao . This 4-day event has occurred every year since 2010 and is now sponsored by the "Salon du Chocolate - Paris". It will be like no other artisan chocolate event you have visited. Imagine Northwest Chocolate Festival & Chocoa, except bigger and most of the booths are from chocolate makers that are actual cacao producers and co-ops who have travelled from all over Peru to showcase both their cacao and their chocolate creations. You'll have a tour of the festival with Aurelio Loret De Mola – an International Awards Chocolate judge (for 7+ years), introducing you to many of the events' presenters, cacao producers/co-ops, and chocolate makers. You'll get to see all the different cacaos from different regions (fresh), and all the ingenious ways they are processed into amazing chocolate, but also syrups, wine, liqueurs, pulp sugars, and much more.	Lima (San Isidro)	Breakfast. All transportation to the Salon de Chocolate y Cacao, to the airport (if required), and event fees. Accommodations.
June/July 2027	Day 9	Depart Lima		Flight back home :(	N/A	Breakfast. Transfer to airport.

Note: This is not a typical tour into the jungles of Peru. Because this trip is a little more off the beaten path, where planning in advance can be trickier, itinerary is subject to change.
